EMERGENCY OVERVIEW

Appearance: dark orange crystalline powder.

Caution! May cause eye irritation and possible burns. Causes skin irritation. Causes digestive and respiratory tract irritation.

Target Organs: Blood.

Potential Health Effects

Eye: Causes eye irritation. May cause eye burns.

Skin: Causes skin irritation. Absorption into the body may cause cyanosis (bluish discoloration of skin due to deficient oxygenation of the blood).

Section 4 - First Aid Measures

Eyes: Immediately flush eyes with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes, occasionally lifting the upper and lower eyelids. Get medical aid immediately.
