Section 3 - Hazards Identification

EMERGENCY OVERVIEW

Appearance: clear yellow to brown liquid. Flash Point: 85 deg C.

Moisture sensitive. The toxicological properties of this material have not been fully investigated.

Target Organs: Respiratory system, eyes, skin.

Potential Health Effects

Eye: Causes eye burns. Lachrymator (substance which increases the flow of tears).

Skin: Causes skin burns.

Ingestion: Causes gastrointestinal tract burns.

Inhalation: May cause irritation of the respiratory tract with burning pain in the nose and throat, coughing, wheezing, shortness of breath and pulmonary edema. Causes chemical burns to the respiratory tract.

Section 4 - First Aid Measures

Eyes: Immediately flush eyes with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes, occasionally lifting the upper and lower eyelids. Get medical aid immediately.

Skin: Get medical aid immediately. Immediately flush skin with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes while removing contaminated clothing and shoes.

Ingestion: Do not induce vomiting. If victim is conscious and alert, give 2-4 cupfuls of milk or water. Get medical aid immediately.

Inhalation: Remove from exposure and move to fresh air immediately. If not breathing, give artificial respiration. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen. Get medical aid.
