EMERGENCY OVERVIEW

Appearance: colorless liquid. Flash Point: 77 deg C.

Caution! May be harmful if inhaled. May be harmful if absorbed through the skin. **Combustible liquid and vapor.** May cause eye and skin irritation. May cause respiratory and digestive tract irritation. May cause central nervous system depression. The toxicological properties of this material have not been fully investigated.

Target Organs: Central nervous system.

Potential Health Effects

Section 4 - First Aid Measures

Eyes: Flush eyes with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes, occasionally lifting the upper and lower eyelids. Get medical aid.

Ingestion: Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Get medical aid. Do NOT induce vomiting. If conscious and alert, rinse mouth and drink 2-4 cupfuls of milk or water.
