Section 3 - Hazards Identification

EMERGENCY OVERVIEW

Appearance: off-white to tan powder.

Warning! Causes eye, skin, and respiratory tract irritation. May cause allergic skin reaction. Hygroscopic (absorbs moisture from the air).

Target Organs: Skin.

Potential Health Effects

Eye: Causes eye irritation. May cause chemical conjunctivitis.

Skin: Causes skin irritation. May cause skin sensitization, an allergic reaction, which becomes evident upon re-exposure to this material.

Ingestion: May cause gastrointestinal irritation with nausea, vomiting and diarrhea. Ingestion of large quantities may cause cardiac arrhythmias and lowering of blood pressure.

Inhalation: Causes respiratory tract irritation. Can produce delayed pulmonary edema. Causes irritation of the mucous membrane and upper respiratory tract.

Chronic: Effects may be delayed.

Section 4 - First Aid Measures

Eyes: Immediately flush eyes with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes, occasionally lifting the upper and lower eyelids. Get medical aid.

Skin: Get medical aid immediately. Immediately flush skin with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes while removing contaminated clothing and shoes. Wash clothing before reuse.

Ingestion: Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Get medical aid. Do NOT induce vomiting. If conscious and alert, rinse mouth and drink 2-4 cupfuls of milk or water.

Inhalation: Remove from exposure and move to fresh air immediately. If not breathing, give artificial respiration. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen. Get medical aid.
