EMERGENCY OVERVIEW

Appearance: colorless crystals. **Danger!** Corrosive. Causes eye and skin irritation and possible burns. May cause severe respiratory tract irritation with possible burns. May cause severe digestive tract irritation with possible burns.

Potential Health Effects

Eye: Contact with eyes may cause severe irritation, and possible eye burns.

Section 4 - First Aid Measures
