Section 3 - Hazards Identification

EMERGENCY OVERVIEW

Appearance: light yellow to light brown solid.

Caution! May cause eye and skin irritation. May cause respiratory tract irritation. Air sensitive.

Target Organs: Eyes, skin, mucous membranes.

Section 4 - First Aid Measures
