### Section 3 - Hazards Identification

#### EMERGENCY OVERVIEW

Appearance: clear, colorless liquid. Flash Point: 78 deg C.

**Danger!** Corrosive. Lachrymator (substance which increases the flow of tears). May cause eye and skin irritation with possible burns.

**Combustible liquid and vapor.** May cause respiratory and digestive tract irritation and possible burns.

**Target Organs:** None.

#### Potential Health Effects

**Eye:** Contact with eyes may cause severe irritation, and possible eye burns.

**Skin:** May cause severe skin irritation with possible burns, especially if skin is wet or moist.

**Ingestion:** May cause severe gastrointestinal tract irritation with nausea, vomiting and possible burns.

**Inhalation:** May cause severe respiratory tract irritation and possible burns.

### Section 4 - First Aid Measures

**Eyes:** Get medical aid immediately. Do NOT allow victim to rub eyes or keep eyes closed. Extensive irrigation with water is required (at least 30 minutes).
